

GET A MOVE ON



Every year, approximately 400,000 servicemembers are given permanent change of station (PCS) orders. Agents like you make finding the right home in a new city easier.

PREPARING TO MOVE

MOVING

FINAL STEPS

- 1 Receive orders to PCS (typically between October and February).
- 2 Research the new location (typically 30 to 60 days prior to a move).
- 3 Organize finances to prepare for a move (moves typically occur between May and August).
- 4 Begin searching for a new home. Some servicemembers spend three to five days visiting the new area while on temporary assignment.

- 5 Take a house-hunting trip 30 days prior to a move, if eligible. Many servicemembers find their agent during this time.



Organize showings and offer video walk-throughs to those unable to visit.

- 6 Pack up. Store remaining items.



Suggest reputable storage facilities nearby.

- 7 Book a hotel.



Suggest nearby accommodations.

- 8 Close on a new home, if not done already.



Work with a USAA Bank Loan Officer to help your eligible clients with the VA home loan process.

- 9 Transfer/set up utilities and forward mail to new address.

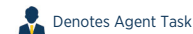
Fun Facts¹

- Usually a two- to five -year assignment
- PSC orders include:
 - Issue date
 - Issuer's name
 - Order number
 - Authorized location
- CONUS: a move inside the continental U.S.
- OCONUS: a move outside the continental U.S., typically overseas but also includes Alaska, Hawaii and U.S. territories
